



About the project

The objective of LMI4VET project is to equip social partners of the VET ecosystem with guidelines and training on how to use labour market information (LMI) in order to better plan their continuing training offer to people with fewer opportunities. By implementing this project, we will achieve:

1. Inclusion-vulnerable people will be ultimately more employable;
2. VET curricula more aligned to the labour market needs; and
3. a more informed VET system, understanding the challenges of the economic cycles.

LMI4VET consists of a partnership between 5 research partners and 5 social partners of the VET ecosystem. The project's coordinator is Prospektiker, S.A. (Spain – research partner) and project partners are:

The project has a duration of 24 months (1 November 2024 – 31 October 2026).

Survey

As part of the tasks of Work Package 2 and as a source of information on the use of LMI by TS_ETSP, we have distributed the following [questionnaire](#).

The objective of the questionnaire is to collect information on the daily reality of TS_ETSP with the use of LMI tools. Then, with the information collected, guidelines and training will be developed on how to use labour market information (LMI) to equip social partners of the VET ecosystem in order to better plan their continuing training offer to people with fewer opportunities.

Next steps

We first analysed LMI tools developed under EU projects or platforms and explored how the VET system can use them. After having the results of the survey, we will codevelop a methodological guide with the social partners. We will then codesign the training content of our online course and a chatbot will be implemented. Finally, both resources will be validated across Europe.

So, the project will have two main tangible results. Both results will be multi-language (English, Spanish, Romanian, French and German) and will be hosted in our website:

- A methodological guide on how to use LMI to plan VET.
 - Interactive training materials including an online course and a chatbot based on AI to train social organisations on how to make an appropriate use of labour market intelligence to best train and guide people with fewer opportunities.
